Project: Delivering CTUK's 2,000th on-road cycle training course to Year 5 & 6
Aims: To ensure school children cycle safely on road
Results: The school has been offering cycle training for the last eight years and feels it contributes greatly to encourage healthy living and safety.



Cycle Training UK (CTUK) celebrated its 2,000th on-road school cycle training course in West Acton Primary School on 20th May. In the last twelve years CTUK has trained around 28,000 school children to cycle safely on roads in London.

Robert Davis from the Transport Strategy Team at Ealing Council was at the school to talk to the children, distribute cycle 'goody' bags and cut the anniversary cake. He said:

"We are very pleased to celebrate this anniversary. CTUK have been staffing our Bicycle Support Team for ten years, and during that time have run 355 on-road courses at schools in the Borough. They have been at the forefront of developing the National Standards - now known as "Bikeability" - for cycle training. This has been crucial in promoting confident cycling, which is a key element in supporting cycling in the Borough."

The school's Deputy Headteacher, Mrs Emma Appelby commented: 'Cycle training is always popular at West Acton Primary. We have been doing it for the last eight years and feel it contributes greatly to encouraging healthy living and staying safe.'
